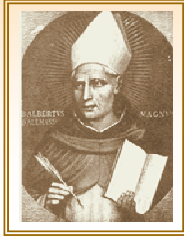

Happy 71st Anniversary



A number of families living in Stickney Township went door to door collecting signatures for a request that parish be established in their area to meet peoples spiritual needs. The petition was presented to Cardinal Stritch. He responded by appointing the Pastor of St. Gerald's, Fr. Loras Welsch to investigate. Fr. Welsch arranged for the first Mass to be celebrated at the old Tobin School. He delegated his associate, Fr. Joseph Phelan to care for this new flock. From that point on Mass was celebrated each Sunday at the school.

A business meeting was set for May 9, 1949. The major outcome was the decision to erect a Mission Church with volunteer labor. The construction on the first church was put into the hands of hundred thirty one man of the parish who literally built the church themselves. The crew worked late at night under flood lights. Despite the weather, with the physical help of the temporary Pastor they poured the foundation of the church.

On December 18 the cornerstone was laid. On Christmas Eve, December 24th, 1949 the first Mass was celebrated. The church was completed in 1950 and formally dedicated by Cardinal Stritch on April 29, 1951.

Because of the continued growth of the parish the original church was enlarged in 1954 and 1955. Finally plans for a large, permanent church on the corner of State Road and Central Avenue were presented to the congregation.

The ground breaking ceremony was held on April 19, 1964 and the cornerstone was laid on the Feast of St. Albert the Great, November 15, 1964. The new church was dedicated on October 3, 1966 by Cardinal Cody.

The contemporary church structure is symbolic of the hill on which Christ was crucified with its steps that lead to a free standing altar. The church has a marble background for figure of the crucified Christ with wood paneling on either side. Seats are arranged so that all may feel part of the liturgy. Light from the beautiful stained glass windows produces a soft and inspiring atmosphere.

What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the gospel. SAINT ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE, (1769-1852)

Pope Benedict once declared himself struck by how remarkably diverse our American saints are—some native born: Mother Seton, Katherine Drexel, Kateri Tekakwitha; most, like many Catholics today, immigrants: Padre Serra, Bishop Neumann, Mother Cabrini, Rose Philippine Duchesne. When the French Revolution that dispersed her convent ended, Rose joined the Religious of the Sacred Heart, volunteering for their United States mission, opening the first free school west of the Mississippi. Only after lengthy service as Superior did Rose—now seventy-one—realize her life’s dream, undertaking a mission among the Potawatomi Indians. When some worried about her advanced age and failing health, the Jesuit mission leader overruled them: “She must come! She may not be able to do much work, but she’ll bring the mission success by praying for us!” Frustrated by her inability to learn their languages, Rose nevertheless “spoke” to the Native Americans by her prayerful presence before the tabernacle. “Quah-kah-ka-num-ad,” they named her, “Woman-Who-Prays-Always”—their way of bestowing the title the Church would later make official: saint! —Peter Scagnelli,

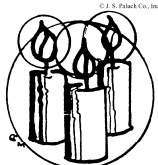

Moi Drodzy Parafianie i Goście!

Ostatnie 2 tygodnie (od 1 listopada do 14 listopada) były dla naszej wspólnoty parafialnej trudnym, ale i koniecznym doświadczeniem. Ta zaistniała sytuacja jeszcze bardziej uświadomiła mi, że jeszcze bardziej muszę „walczyć” o **WAS** wszystkich! Cieszę się, że tak wielu z **Was** było i jest zjednoczonych z nami. Każdy z **Was** jest bardzo ważny dla mnie! Bardzo wielu z **Was** powróciło już do swojego kościoła. Tym zaś, którzy w trosce o swoje i bliskich zdrowie pozostają w domach dajemy kolejną możliwość bycia razem na Mszy Świętej przez internet. Od 2 tygodni mamy z powrotem **Mszę Świętą-Livestream w języku angielskim o godz. 9:00 rano**. Proszę bądźcie zawsze z nami. Duchowo łączcie się z nami i ze swoją ukochaną parafią. Bądźmy razem na dobre i na złe! W swoim codziennym życiu bądźcie roztropni i gotowi na przyjęcie lepszych dni. Nie ulegajcie podszeptom złych ludzi, którzy niestety są też wokół nas. Moją ogromną wdzięczność za wszelkie dobro duchowe i materialne względem naszej parafii wyrażam gorliwą i serdeczną modlitwą tak za żyjących jak i zmarłych z naszych rodzin.

Dzień Pański i Sąd. W księgach prorockich Starego Testamentu często spotykamy określenie dzień Pański albo dzień Pana na oznaczenie przybycia czy szczególnej, uroczystej interwencji Boga. Chodzi o czas, w którym Bóg objawi w pełni władzę królewską. W Starym Testamencie związany jest z Bogiem, a natomiast w Nowym Testamencie z Jezusem. W późniejszych listach Paweł akcentuje nie tylko aspekt triumfalistyczny, obecny w popularnych oczekiwaniach, ale także aspekt zbawienia i potępienia. Do tej koncepcji odwołuje się Paweł, przeciwstawiając los wierzących-zbawionych losowi niewierzących-potępionych. Apostoł daje do zrozumienia, że dzień Pański nastąpi nagle i niespodziewanie. Jednak obraz nocnego złodzieja nie jest nigdyłączony z przyjściem Pana. Grecki czas terażniejszy (dosłownie: przychodzi) posiada także zabarwienie przyszłościowe, ale nie można wykluczyć, iż Pawłowi chodzi w tym wypadku o coś, co już się dokonuje. Noc jest w Starym Testamencie czasem nieobecności światła i z tego powodu nabiera znaczenia metaforycznego. W jej ciemnościach budzą się w człowieku różne wady (pijaństwo, rozpusta) i grzechy. Noc jest także przeciwieństwem zbawienia.

Wciąż możemy zabrać do domu i wypełnić kopertki na tzw. „Wypominki Listopadowe”. Przez cały miesiąc listopad naszą serdeczną i życzliwą modlitwą ogarniamy naszych bliskich krewnych zmarłych. Kopertki na Wypominki możemy składać do specjalnego koszyka, który znajduje się w prezbiterium.



CO MOGĘ DLA CIEBIE ZROBIĆ?

Widok człowieka zebrzącego często „wytrąca nas z równowagi”. Przeważnie nie wiemy, jak zareagować. Czy dać mu to, o co prosi, czy zostawić to innym? Czy naprawdę jest biedny, czy tylko udaje? Chcielibyśmy, aby ktoś nam jasno powiedział, jak się zachować w takiej sytuacji. Tymczasem nikt tego nie robi za nas. Jesteśmy wyposażeni przez Pana Boga w rozmaite talenty i temperamenty, różnorodną wrażliwość. Dlatego, znając to wszystko, sami podejmujemy decyzję, co należy zrobić. Może nie pieniądze, a rozmowa? Ta nasza różnorodność jest nam dana, abyśmy się nawzajem dopełniali. Tymczasem bywa tak, że człowiek jest do tego stopnia zajęty kształtowaniem swego charakteru czy samopoznaniem, że nie ma już czasu na zainteresowanie się bliźnim. Praca nad sobą jest potrzebna po to, aby zrealizować to, do czego powołał nas Pan Bóg. Do służenia sobie nawzajem. Poznaję siebie, abym wiedział, w jaki sposób mogę pomóc bliźniemu. „Szczęśliwy człowiek, który służy Panu i chodzi jego drogami” (Ps 128,1). Służba bliźniemu, to służba Bogu. A Boże drogi, to te prowadzące od człowieka do człowieka. Mój rozum, który jest darem Ducha Świętego, pozwala mi rozpoznać, w jaki sposób mogę pomóc temu konkretnemu człowiekowi. A gdy mam z tym trudność, to korzystam z daru wspólnego nam wszystkim. Ten dar to miłość. Każdy ją w sobie ma. Mogę okazywać miłość tak jak potrafię. I wtedy odkryję, że tej miłości mam w sobie bardzo dużo. Bo Pan
